SCFSC began work on a shaded fuel break along Bullskin Ridge, located between Phillips Road and Bullskin Road near the community of Oak Run in Shasta County. A 600-foot wide shaded fuel break is being constructed on the ridge top and will include approximately 290 acres of forest land. The purpose of this project is to create a fuel break that would improve fire safety for the community of Oak Run and beyond, as well as protect mature timberlands and the Oak Run Creek Watershed, which provide vital ecosystem services and are home to countless species of wildlife as well as some of the largest, oldest ponderosa pine trees in Shasta County. Federal Disaster Tax Relief Act

The **Federal Disaster Tax Relief Act** allows individuals to exclude certain payments from their taxable income if they were received as compensation for expenses or losses caused by a federally declared wildfire disaster after 2014. This means settlement money for wildfire damages is not considered taxable. Additionally, if you've already paid taxes on such compensation, you may qualify for a refund. Contact a tax professional for more details and assistance.

Homeowners Insurance

The Department of Insurance is adopting and amending regulations regarding rate application and variance request requirements for insurers, which are part of the regulations implementing Proposition 103. Specifically, these regulations will, amongst other things,

1. permit insurers to use forward-looking catastrophe models in their rate calculations.

New Cal Fire Programs

Cal Fire launched it's <u>Fuels Treatment Effectiveness Reporting</u> interactive map, which reviews how fuel reduction activities impact fire behavior. Local fires from summer 2024 that were influenced by previous fuel treatments include the Highway and Hay fires along Hwy 44 and the Clear Fire on Clear Creek.

SB 504 provides additional time for existing homes to comply with Zone 0 regulations once they are adopted and allows them to come into compliance over a longer period of time. It also makes important changes to facilitate the adoption of zone 0, including clarification that defensible space is not just for average whether conditions, but all for windy days when wildfires often happen.

SB 675 requires the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection and the Department of Conservation to consider and incorporate prescribed grazing in local assistance grant programs.
